### **LOGICLIBRARY PROMINENTLY RECOGNIZED AGAIN AT THE 2005 TECHNOLOGY 50 AWARDS**

*CEO Greg Coticchia Earns Third Straight Nomination for Leading Pittsburgh-based  
Software Company to National Prominence*
