- Overview** LogicLibrary is a fast-growing start-up that offers enterprise users the software and services they need to get started with Web services. Founded in 2000, LogicLibrary is privately held and based in Pittsburgh, PA, with a product development team in Minnesota and sales offices throughout the country.
- Technology** LogicLibrary's flagship product, Logidex, is a software development asset (SDA) mapping and discovery engine that represents inherently complex, enterprise application environments in a graphical, intuitive way. The Logidex SDA Library is a catalog of SDAs and their relationships to each other, the company's business processes and the technical infrastructure. SDAs can include legacy applications, components, XML schemas, database tables, patterns, frameworks and other key building blocks of application development. This inventory of software and business relationships is the first step for Web services and other development and integration initiatives.
- Software developers, architects and business analysts can search the SDA Library using the Logidex discovery engine, which offers capabilities ranging from simple keyword searches to sophisticated, model-based searches. Only Logidex provides a one-of-a-kind *Active Design*[™] that enables users to search based on the technical and business processes the SDAs support. It's the only solution that identifies **what** software assets exist, **where** they're located, and **understands how** each fits into a company's business and technical landscape.
- Market** LogicLibrary sits at the nexus of two fast-growing markets: Web services and application development, both of which IDC predicts will independently grow to more than \$30 billion.
